Also, if your child is a 10th grader and currently enrolled in Algebra II, we are encouraging you to encourage your child to also register because this is one of the best oppor-

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End Of Course Assessment NEWS

Louisiana's Department of Education has some changes to the End of Course (EOC) Test for English I, English II, Algebra I, Geometry and US History classes. The new computer-based test is called LEAP 2025. It consists of five scoring levels (Advanced, Mastery, Basic, Approaching Basic, and Unsatisfactory). Also, the test is now **TIMED**. The tests consist of multiple choice, multiple select (more than one answer), fill in the blank, constructed response, and technology enhanced test items (equation builder, drag and drop, etc.).



provided schools with the computer-based program called LEAP 360 that has interim assessments and practice tests. English I, English II, Algebra I and Geometry students will be able to take advantage of these computer-based interim assessments and practice tests throughout the semester. Please encourage your child to prepare for these interim assessments and practice tests!

The next ACT is **December 9, 2017**. The registration deadline is November 3rd. The cost of the ACT is \$46.00.

Only students who are on free or reduced lunch are eligible to receive an ACT waiver.

Additionally, students who qualify for a waiver are only allotted a total of (2) waivers per their entire high school career. These waivers are not unlimited.

Students may see Mrs. Ward-Lewis in the curriculum office for an ACT waiver once they become available.
